As Historians/Geographers can we...?

Discuss the achievements of the earliest civilizations – an overview of the impact the Ancient Egyptians had on our society.

As Scientists can we...?

Investigate how objects move?
Design a parachute to understand air resistance.

Using technology can we...?

Record, edit and evaluate our own voice recordings
Download, manage and edit existing sound files

As Musicians can we...?

Identify the inter-related dimensions of music.
Learn a given tune.
Improvise using tuned and un-tuned percussion instruments.

As Writers can we...?

Write a diary, create first person accounts and develop the structure of a story.
Identify how imagery is used to create mood and develop characters.
Write newspaper reports looking at bias and opinion.

As Readers can we...?

Read daily.
Compare themes in texts and compare the work of an author.

As Designers can we...?

Sketch faces then design and make an Egyptian Death Mask.

As Mathematicians can we...?

Identify missing numbers in linear sequences
Apply the four operations into problem solving and reasoning
Convert between units of measure
Recall rapidly the times table facts up to 12 x 12.

Implement invasion games to develop skills involving passing by kicking and striking, receiving, dribbling and shooting.
