#### Funding your child's place at Pre-School

Every 3 and 4 year old is entitled to 570 hours of universal funded education and childcare per year, this is usually known as 15 hours funding. Children are eligible from the term after they are three. The funding is universal and parents/carers do not need to apply for it.

The children of working parents may also be entitled to an additional 15 hours of funding, often referred to as 30 hours funding. Parents/carers need to check eligibility and apply online <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/">https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/</a>

The school accepts childcare vouchers for payment of unfunded sessions and lunch fees.


