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## What is Forest School?

The concept of Forest School first originated in Scandinavia in the 1950's and was widely adopted in Denmark. Over the last 30 years' forest school has developed widely in the UK and allows children to develop a learner-led education through self-discovery within a natural outdoor environment. Forest School aims to promote a holistic approach to all involved and allows children to develop:

- $\star$  self confidence and self esteem
- $\star$  problem solving skills
- $\star$  an understanding of risk and self discovery
- $\star$  team building and working with others
- $\star$  leadership skills

## What are the principles of Forest School?

- Forest School is a long-term process of regular sessions, rather than one-off or infrequent visits.
- Forest School takes place in a woodland or natural environment to support the development of a lifelong relationship between the learner and the natural world.
- Forest School uses a range of learner-centred processes to create a community for being, development and learning.
- Forest School aims to promote the holistic development of all involved, fostering resilient, confident, independent and creative learners.
- Forest School offers learners the opportunity to take supported risks appropriate to the environment and to themselves.
- Forest School is run by our qualified Forest School practitioner, who continuously maintains and develops their professional practice.

## How often does my child do Forest School?
