Use field work to observe measure present and record physical features in the local area

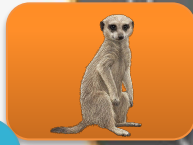


YEAR SIX

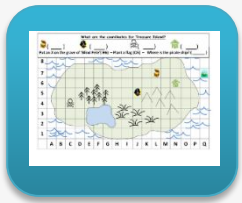


Locational & Place Knowledge
