THIS MONTH'S TOP TIPS FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY

Due to COVID-19 and the partial school closure, children are spending more time on devices. It can be hard to know when to make the announcement that it is time for devices to be "OFF!" Here are some Top Tips:

- ☐ It's important to get the balance right, especially as children get older and strive for more freedom.
- ☐ Too much time on devices can affect your sleep and mood.
- Have a set time when devices are turned off in the home keep to it (it will be easier to manage in the long-run).
- Have a 'no device' meal time enjoy just chatting without the temptation to check devices.
- Plan activities that you can all do away from devices a walk in the woods, gardening, art activities, small indoor projects etc.
- Try and plan some 'down time' as a family you could make this a regular weekly event maybe each family member could take it in turns for ideas.

ONLINE SAFETY FOCUS Houseparty

What is Houseparty?

Houseparty is a group video chat. Since lockdown, this app has become very popular as it gives you the oppertunity to connect visually with your friends.

What is the minimum age that you can use this app?

13

What do you need to be mindful of?

- Set up a unique password.
- Be careful about who you add as friends - only accept friend requests from who you know.
- Be very mindful about what you share.
- Make sure you use 'Private Mode'.
- Never share any personal information with anyone.
- Remember you can't stop another person screenshotting you, so be very wise about who your friends are on this platform.
- Make sure you know how to 'Block' and 'Report'.

What about bullying?

Remember to report any concerns around bullying to your parents/carers and also school.

ONLINE SAFETY FOCUS WhatsApp

What is WhatsApp?

WhatsApp is a free messaging app owned by Facebook. It lets you make videos, send messages individually or within a group.

What is the minimum age that you can use this app?

16

What do you need to be mindful of?

- Keep your personal information and location private.
- Be very mindful about what you share - once it is out there, it's out there.
- It is easy for another person to add a contact to a group on WhatsApp - you need to be aware of this as this could potentially be a person you do not wish to share your contact details with.
- Know how to 'Report' and 'Block' a unknown person.
- Remember, you can leave a group chat whenever you want to.
