ROAD SAFETY OUTSIDE SCHOOL

With lockdown restrictions slightly eased, we are all enjoying the opportunity to get out and about a little more. The warmer months will be upon us very soon, days are lighter and we are definitely finding that there are now more cars on the road.

We want to ensure that our children have a very safe journey to school - this is everyone's responsibility. Here are a few simple steps we can all take to keep everyone safe:

- Crossing the road safely with Martin our lollipop man
- Making sure children are supervised on the way to and from school
- Being visible on darker evenings
- If driving, parking in the correct areas, observing the zig-zag lines and restrictions in place
- Ensuring your children have a good awareness of road safety (see Green Cross Code) on next page
- If scooting to school or cycling, ensure your child wears a helmet and dismounts on congested pavement areas and prior to entering the school gate.

ALL ABOUT ROAD SAFETY Green Cross Code

To be safe on the road you need to follow the Green Cross Code		Useful websites for Road Safety Video aimed at younger children, BBC Bitesize Personal Development
1. THINK	Always find a safe place to cross the road and try to use a controlled crossing point, zebra crossing, traffic island, pelican crossing, puffin crossing, toucan crossing, footbridge or subway. 2. STOP	Stop before you get to the kerb. Make sure you are with a grown-up when you cross. Make sure you can see the traffic from both directions. 3. LOOK and LISTEN	Look around for traffic. Look RIGHT, then LEFT and then RIGHT again. Look out for bikes and scooters. Some electric cars are very hard to hear, so you must look. Do not wear headphones whilst crossing the road.	Parking outside school Please be aware of the following restrictions outside our school
4. WAIT	If at a crossing, wait for the green man before crossing. If you are not at a crossing, wait until cars have passed and it is safe to cross.	B Traffic
