ROAD SAFETY and PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL

Please help to keep our children safe when parking outside school. We often receive feedback from residents and other parents/carers around parking and the extra congestion around school pick-up and drop-off. Most importantly, we want to keep our children safe.

Please can we ask everyone to:

- Drive responsibly and carefully outside school
- Park responsibly and respectfully with due consideration to residents
- Be aware of the restrictions directly outside the school

We have a very good rapport with our neighbouring residents and ask for your support to help us maintain these good relations.

We do appreciate and fully understand that not everyone has the option to walk to school, however, there are many benefits in walking to school:

- Good form of exercise for general health
- An opportunity for children to release some energy before coming to school
- An opportunity to chat to your child without other distractions
- Provides an opportunity to practice good road safety
- Helps to promote good mental health and wellbeing

We want to ensure that our children have a very safe journey to school - this is everyone's responsibility. Here are a few simple steps we can all take to keep everyone safe:

- Crossing the road safely with Martin our lollipop man
- Making sure children are supervised on the way to and from school
- Being visible on darker evenings
- If driving, parking in the correct areas, observing the zig-zag lines and restrictions in place
- Ensuring your children have a good awareness of road safety. See Green Cross Code on previous bulletin
- If scooting to school or cycling, ensure your child wears a helmet and dismounts on congested pavement areas and prior to entering the school gate
