We would like to remind families that attendance at school is mandatory and we ask for your support in ensuring that any routine appointments are made outside of school hours and that term time holidays are not taken. Please also ensure that children are in school on time each day. Our 'soft drop' option is available from **8.40-8.50am** where learning activities are set and children enjoy a settled start to the school day - we encourage **all** children to take advantage of this time. Any child arriving between 8.50am and 9am will be signed in through the gate and/or office as registers are promptly closed at 9am, with lessons starting immediately after. Please try to avoid 'lateness' as much as possible as this allows teaching and support staff to focus on their duties, prevents any disruption to the start of learning time and allows your child to have a settled and calm start to their school day.



We are all very excited for the year ahead; teaching have rigorously prepared for learning children's and development and are very much looking forward to delivering an exciting engaging curriculum! Our door is always open, please let us know if you need any help or have any questions.
