Dear Parents and Carers,

A very warm welcome back and a very special welcome to our Biggin Hill Pre-School, Reception and new families joining us this year - we welcome you all to our school community.

The children have had a wonderful first week back and all seem very settled and happy. Although we have returned to what feels like "normality", we are still maintaining our systems of control to keep everyone as safe as possible; and the children are already back into the hand washing and sanitising routines!
