YEAR 2 <u>Learning about Kenya</u>



Year 2 have been busy learning lots about Kenya. We started off by finding Kenya on a map. We had already found Jamaica on a map so we could compare the two countries. We noticed that Kenya, unlike Jamaica, isn't an island but they are both warmer than England because they are nearer the Equator.

We learnt all about what it is like to go to school in Kenya. We saw that Kenyan children have lessons, assembly and breaktime just like us, but there were some differences too.

We had fun learning about the "Big Five" animals - do you know what they are?

We looked at artwork by a Kenyan artist called Martin Bullinya. We noticed that he used primary colours to create different shades of orange. We practised mixing colours to create our own art in the same style.
