
Buzz Days

Year 4 Roman Day

Year 4 enjoyed a fun-filled Roman Day last Friday! We began our day making laurel wreaths and explored arefacts (some from over 2000 years ago!) to determine what life was like in Lullingstone Roman Villa. Then, we used clay to make Roman coins and designed and created our own mosaics. Thank you to the parents/carers for supporting the children coming in wearing authentic clothing which added to the authenticity of the day. Thank you for the donations to Lullingstone Roman Villa. It was a very enjoyable day for both children and adults!



Year 5 Science Year 5 were thinking about different jobs that involve scientific understanding or scientific skills. At the start of the day we thought of lots of jobs like astronaut, doctor and dentist. We then discovered that Miss Coster used to be a baker! Miss Coster showed us how to make bread and explained all the scientific processes involved in making bread. We observed the bubbles and how the mixture changed as we worked the dough. In the afternoon we learned about all the scientific understanding and skills involved in designing a garden. We went for a walk around the school and identified possible locations for a flower bed. We discussed how each location was slightly different and how this would impact the plants there. We then selected a site and planned what we would include in our garden and why. The children were really creative, thinking about how their plants would thrive, how it would look nice and how they would attract pollinators. By the end of the day we were able to add more ideas to our list of jobs which involve scientific skills or understanding as none of us had originally thought of baker or gardener.
