Dear Parents and Carers,



A very warm welcome back to school to all our children and families - we hope you all managed to enjoy the festive period and had the opportunity to see family and friends.

I am delighted to advise that our children have come back to school full of enthusiasm and seem very happy and settled. As you know, we have lifted the restrictions that were put in place just before Christmas and very much hope that there

is no need to revert to these this term. That said, we will of course keep a close eye on the situation and will continue to ensure that our systems of control remain in place. Please can I remind everyone of the need and importance of wearing masks on site, this will help to minimise the risk of transmission and will help to keep our children and the wider school community safe. Also, if you are coming into school for a meeting, we politely request that you complete an LFD test beforehand.

The rules have changed again and from Tuesday 11th January anyone who is asymptomatic and has a positive result from a lateral flow test should assume that they have COVID and complete a minimum of 7 days isolation, this should be done rather than completing a PCR test. Anyone who is symptomatic should book a PCR test and follow the government advice.

I am also pleased to announce that two new staff have joined our fabulous support staff team; Miss Mercer, Learning Support Assistant in KS2 and Miss Buck, Early Years Practitioner in our Pre-School. On behalf of all the staff and leadership team, I would like to extend a very warm welcome to BHPS.

"I love to make things better and make people happier, also to make things more gentle. This is what made me want to be part of the school council."




