### **COMPUTING**

What is Computing at Biggin Hill Primary School?

Our children are taught Computing through the Kapow scheme of work.

Last term, (October - December) **Year 2** were asked to consider what came to their minds when we talk about computers? Children mentioned a screen, mouse and keyboard. With the use of iPads we explored exactly what a computer is by identifying and learning how inputs and outputs work, how computers are used in our school as well as the wider world. Following this they designed their own computerised invention. **Year 3** with the use of iPads looked at how we communicate across the school, local area and the world, all at a touch of a button! We studied submarine cables (Did you know they were first laid back in the 1850s to send morse code?), why they were first invented and how they now allow major world wide web companies to send information so quickly. We ended the unit learning how important computers are in supermarkets - without them would your local shop have your favourite pizza available when you wanted it! **Year 6** started the unit by being World War II codebreakers, just like the men and women based at Bletchley Park 1939-1945. This was a principal place in breaking codes so allowing us to win the war. We then used computers to learn about the history of computers and how they have evolved over time. The children were amazed that I only used my first computer when I was 19 years old! Do you know why we should have secure passwords? We tested passwords on others to see how quickly we could guess them (most were very easy to guess). Following this, we realised why a secure password was so crucial to keeping our private information safe. Finally, we went on to research some of the historical figures that had contributed to technological advances in computing and produce a presentation on these historical figures.
