## MESSAGE FROM MRS FREEMAN



Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been so nice to welcome everyone back to school this week to what I hope will be a brilliant term. The children have really enjoyed being back to normal routines - as have the staff!

As I mentioned in my email to you on 17th February, and after the valuable feedback from our parent forum group, we will be keeping the side exit gate open at collection time to ease congestion. Just before the end of the half-term, the leadership team held Pupil Progress Reviews (PPRs) with teaching teams across the school and the information from these important reviews will inform our teaching this term. Children in both year 2 and 6 will be preparing for statutory assessments, which the DfE have confirmed will take place in all primary schools across England this year.

Year 4 and year 5 have been building dens and assault courses to develop problem solving and team building skills using a range of loose parts. Year 1 have been using a magnifying glass to hunt for minibeasts in forest school with the use of picture cards for identification. They have also been making hedgehog creatures using mud and natural materials within forest school. They have also made wind chimes which fits in with their class topic for this term.
