CAREERS AND ASPIRATIONS DAY Friday, 25th February 2022



Last Friday we enjoyed Careers and Aspirations Day at Biggin Hill Primary School. We had a full day of career related learning activities and a day enriched by external speakers who spoke to the children all about their jobs and fields of work.

We were joined by the Metropolitan Police. PCSO Cumner, PC Gilliham, PC Metcalfe and PC Russen who talked about the different policing careers ranging from a police officer, The Metropolitan Police Mounted Branch, Traffic Police, Air Support Unit, Marine Policing, Territorial Support Group and other specialist roles on offer within the Metropolitan Police. Children enjoyed asking questions about the various job roles, the uniform that a police officer wears and type of equipment they use.

A doctor and medical educator, Dr Parry, visited classes to talk about his career as a doctor at King's College London, his work with general surgery and how to become a doctor. He also talked about his current work, which is training doctors and the outreach work he does to promote the wide range of medical careers available.

Mrs Allen, a veterinary nurse, talked about veterinary nursing and the sort of work you would do in this job, the qualifications and experience needed and how to care for animals. Children also asked about the different veterinary careers and the work involved in each.

Mrs Horgan spoke to classes about becoming a swimming teacher and the sort of skills, qualifications and experience you would need to be successful in this work as well as how much she had enjoyed teaching children to swim in the past.

Miss Wolfcarius, an animation producer, spoke to year groups about careers in the animation industry, the sorts of jobs in this field, skills and qualifications needed for this sort of work and the qualities needed to support script writing, voice acting and studio work. She also shared some tips on making successful movies.







CAREERS AND ASPIRATIONS DAY Friday, 25th February 2022



Mr Rooney, an advertising consultant, spoke to some of our KS2 children about careers within advertising and marketing and the sorts of skills and qualities that you would need to work in this area. The children explored the power of branding, looked at why companies spend money on advertising and the different sorts of advertising and marketing mediums used to promote brands.

Mrs Helps and Mr Devlin also delivered a workshop to Year 6 titled 'How to stand out from the Crowd'. The workshop looked at opportunities both inside and outside of school, what's on offer at secondary school, what are skills and education post 16 and beyond. Children also looked at some template C.Vs.

Some of our speakers also joined both myself and Mrs Woods, our Chair of Governors, for lunch so we could chat a little more informally about the school and the experiences of the children during the day.



We would like to thank all of our speakers for giving up their time to come and speak to our children on Careers and Aspirations Day.

From speaking to staff and children during the week, it is clear that Careers and Aspirations Day was very well received throughout the school. Having a whole day dedicated to careers related learning is not something that we have ever done before and having visitors speak to the children about their chosen careers really brought it to life for them. Our experience gained from the day will be used to build and shape our Careers and Aspirations Day in 2023.

On behalf of the children and staff at Biggin Hill Primary School, thank you to all our speakers for supporting us with Careers and Aspirations Day - it was a great success!
