LEGO THERAPY

Builder, Engineer, Supplier and Director!

A fun interactive group which takes place on a Thursday afternoon in the Aspire classroom. Lego therapy is great for children who may struggle with social and communication skills. It helps to build a

child's confidence, develop their ability to use their voice in class, problem solve, take turns, listen and follow instructions. Each child is given a role:

Builder - listens to the engineer and puts the pieces together.

Engineer - gives instructions to the supplier and the builder.

Supplier - listens to the engineer and finds the pieces.

Director - makes sure everyone works together.
