#### **PUPIL VOICE - COMPUTING LEAD**

Biggin Hill Primary School

One way of finding out what is happening in school is to ask the people who are experiencing it - the pupils! Pupil Voice is important as it gives pupils an opportunity to express their views on what happens at school. Last week I asked the pupils their thoughts on their Computing lessons with Junior Jam. I asked a wide mix of pupils from Year 1 to Year 6 and the response was overwhelmingly positive. Nearly every pupil said they enjoyed their computing lessons with Mr Small. Pupils could explain the skills they had learnt in their lessons and they knew they had made lots of progress since the start of the year. There was always help if they needed it and they really liked Mr Small's snazzy dance moves. In particular, Year 5 and 6 enjoyed the freedom they were given to choose how to complete a task. Many of the pupils explained how they often went home and downloaded the same apps from the lesson so they could continue to explore them. It was a pleasure talking to the children and it was lovely to see and hear their enthusiasm for Computing. In fact one pupil stated that "Mr Small had inspired him to have a career in computing."


# YEAR 1 Did you see a Spaceship?
