FRENCH AT BIGGIN HILL PRIMARY SCHOOL

The wonderful world of languages!

From Year 3 to Year 6 the children learn French.

Initially, most children are very excited at the idea of being able to speak a different language and are very keen to learn. That said, it's fair to say that it isn't everyone's cup of tea - and that's ok - all we ask is that children have a go so that over time their confidence with (and therefore their enjoyment of) the language increases.

Throughout their 4 years of learning, they will be taught a range of vocabulary that gradually builds so that by the time they reach year 6 they are hopefully able to translate whole passages from French to English and vice versa! It's lovely to see their surprise when they realise they can work out the gist of a paragraph even if they are unsure of some of the words.

Although French is not taught in Key Stage 1, the children there are given their first taste of French when we have our French Day - an interactive workshop where they visit our cafe and hear the older children ordering in French. This event is very popular regardless of whether or not they enjoy the subject!

It's always lovely when previous pupils return and say that what they learnt here really helped them if they continued to learn French when they moved on to key stage 3, which is all we want to hear and makes it all worthwhile.
