SCIENCE WEEK

Fantastic Science

This week has been Science Week! Every class has been doing a variety of enrichment activities, including both practical work linked to their class topics and lessons using the Primary Nature Live resources, produced by the Field Studies Council.

EYFS have been practising their observation skills during their work on life cycles, looking carefully at frogspawn, baby chicks, caterpillars and a wasp nest.



Years 1, 2 and 3 have been learning all about plants. Year 1 have been outdoors, looking for roots, stems, leaves and flowers while Year 2 have been planting sunflowers and observing them growing. Year 3 have done an investigation using food dye and celery to learn about the function of a plant's stem.



Higher up the school, children have been exploring local woodland and investigating how electricity works by building circuits.
