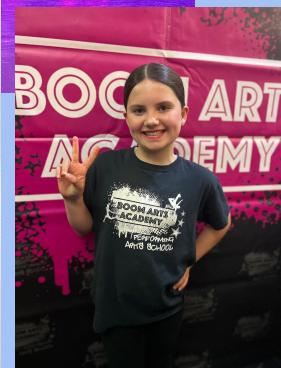

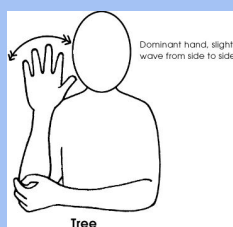
Roll of Honour
