MESSAGE FROM MRS FREEMAN



Dear Parents and Carers,

I do hope everyone had a lovely half term break and enjoyed the time away from the routines of school. I know there were many families and staff isolating over the holiday period, which I know will not have been easy. If any families do feel they need any support, please do not hesitate to contact us - we are here to help.

I am delighted to announce that Mrs Lawrence was appointed to the post of Deputy Headteacher on Monday. On behalf of all the staff here, I would like to congratulate Mrs Lawrence on her permanent appointment. Mrs Lawrence, as deputy head for our school, will continue to lead on SEND and Inclusion as well as maintain her responsibilities around safeguarding as well as the day to day and strategic leadership of the school.

You will have also noticed that on Tuesday and Wednesday we sent out some information from the NHS South East London Clinical Commissioning Group and the Bromley GP Alliance with regard to 'Pop-up' vaccination clinics locally. There has been a concerning increase in Covid-19 cases within the Biggin Hill area and it is important to ensure that as many people as possible are made aware of the vaccination clinics running locally.

In school, our system of controls continues and the school was also deep cleaned and "fogged" during half term as an additional safety measure. Please do rest assured that we are continuously working with Public Health England (PHE), Bromley Council and the relevant agencies as and when we need to. We are doing everything we can to safeguard our children and staff.

"You can ask a friend."


"Ask any teacher and ask people next to or near me."
