Dear Parents and Carers,

22nd July:

An outdoor graduation ceremony for Nursery children is planned for the afternoon and parents and carers will be invited to attend if restrictions are lifted. If restrictions have not been lifted we will have to limit the number of adults permitted to attend.

23rd July:

Y6 Graduation will take place (probably outside) after school for parents and carers if restrictions are lifted. If they have not been lifted, the event will be re-planned for during the school day and a limited number of adults will be invited to attend.

The special ambassador and Headteacher assemblies will take place in the final week and it is most likely that these will be hosted virtually. These events will be by invitation only and parents and carers will be invited via email.

COVID SYSTEMS OF CONTROL
