Parent Forum and Class Representatives - we need you!

We are very keen to set up a 'Parent/Carer Forum and Class Representatives' group at the start of the next academic year and would like to hear from you!

Our main rationale for this initiative is to ensure that we are continuously working to involve parents and carers with an aim of improving our practice based on a wide cross section of views.

It is anticipated that this group will have two main areas of focus:

- To contribute to our 'parent/carer forum' and meet approximately 3 to 4 times during the academic year to discuss the school, its vision and aims and school improvement. There will of course be some standard agenda items for each meeting, however there may be a multitude of initiatives that we may seek your views on. It is anticipated that we will alternate meetings between morning/afternoon and evenings. Guidelines permitting, we hope these will be in person, however these can also easily be hosted over Google Meet if required.
- One parent/carer to act as a 'class representative' for their child's class to feedback the views of the parents/carers within the class. This would be both at the forums and also to feed key information to the class teacher. The class representative would also help to pass on reminders and information to the class.

We are exceptionally proud of our school and are committed to providing the very best to all the children from nursery to year 6.

We continuously seek the views of our children through Pupil Voice, which you will have seen on our newsletter. Having a parent forum and class representative group will complement this and help us to gain a well-rounded view of all stakeholders within the school.
