This week each class held a special assembly around firework safety. We know how much the children enjoy fireworks and wanted to ensure that they all understand how to keep themselves safe on Bonfire Night. FIREWORK SAFETY

Fireworks are always fun for the family to watch and enjoy - here are some `Top Tips' for keeping as safe as possible:

Where possible, try to attend an organised firework display with your family as these are strictly organised, safe and marshalled.





If you are unable to attend an organised event, please do remember the following:

- It is illegal for any person under the age of 18 to buy fireworks.
- Fireworks must be purchased from licensed retailers only and are only sold on selected dates of the year.
- Only buy fireworks that carry the CE mark, keep them in a closed box and follow all instructions.
- Know what fireworks you can use at home
- Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- Remember your neighbours let them know if you are planning to have fireworks - they will appreciate being told.
- On nights where fireworks are being let off keep pets safe inside.

Finally, always follow the **Firework Code**.

SQUID GAME

Squid Game is a programme on Netflix and is rated a **15** due to its violent and sexual content. This is **NOT SUITABLE** for primary school children.

Unfortunately we have received reports of some younger children watching Squid Game. There are also reports in the media that parts of this programme have been "recreated" on social media and there are games on social media that are based on this programme. Advice for parents/carers:

- It might be tempting to, but don't directly raise Squid Game with your child – they might be unaware of it, and mentioning it could make them more likely to seek it out.
- Do let your child know they can talk to you about anything they see online that they find upsetting. If you hear them talking about Squid Game or if they mention it to you, talk to them about how the show isn't meant for young children.
- Check your Netflix settings for your child's profile. You can set maturity ratings so that your child only sees TV shows and films that have a rating suitable for their age.

If we are made aware that a child is watching Squid Game - we will contact parents/carers directly.
