Every School Day Counts

Last week, I wrote to all parents and carers regarding the work we are doing to review our attendance systems in school. Thank you to those who have already started to use Studybugs. I hope that you have found this a useful way to report absence due to illness for your child.

Later today, you should be receiving an email with your child's current attendance to date. This is an automated email which details their current percentage attendance, and where this fits on our traffic light system. We do understand that only a few days absence can soon start to impact a child's attendance - especially during the first half term - but we hope that you find this information useful.

If you are concerned about your child's attendance or feel there is more we could do to support you with this, please do not hesitate to contact myself directly by email: a.devlin@bigginhillps.com.

As well as reporting absence due to illness, it is important that we are informed of any planned absences in advance. Leave of absence forms are available from Reception. Please note that holidays should be taken outside of term time. We are only permitted to authorise holidays during term time in very limited and exceptional circumstances.
